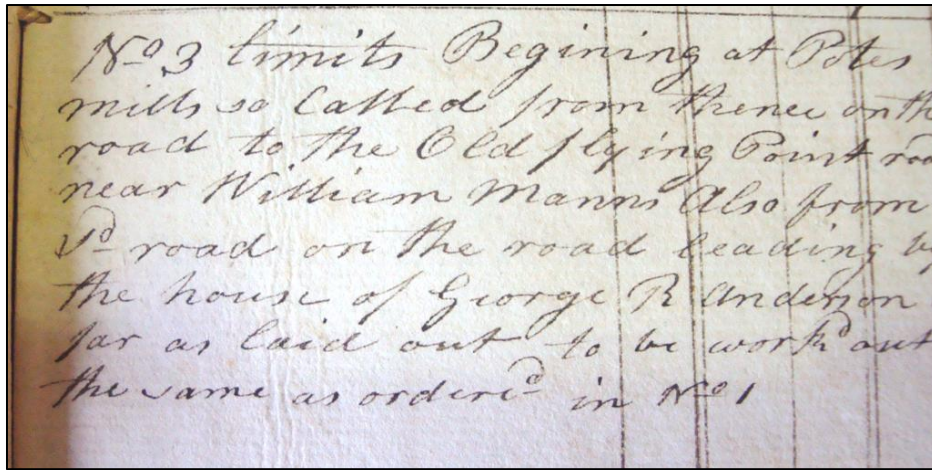
This list shows the names as they appear in each district from the Freeport Tax Book (1810--1825). For tax and poll amounts see the original manuscript at the Freeport Library. Thank you to Vicki Lowe, Assistant Librarian, for making this manuscript accessible and helping to proof the transcription. Note: some modern location descriptions have been added. The road district limits were taken from the 1815 road tax list as indicated in the actual record. See page 2 of this document for a photo of the description of District 3.

"To Robert Jameson surveyor of roads you are hereby required to cause each person named in this bill to work out the several sums annexed to their names on the following road viz Beginning at Col. George Rogers house thence on the County road to Brunswick line allowing to each man and each yoke of oxen one dollar, each plow 50 cents and each cart 25 cents per day for which this shall be your sufficient warrant and you are to cause one half of the within sum to be worked out by the first of July next and the remainder by the first of October next by which time you are to make returns of this bill with your doings thereon."
